CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER

Mrs. Kathy Allavie, Board President, called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m.

CEREMONIAL SIGNING AND ACTION

1. STEM Partnership Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Between Riverside Unified School District (RUSD) and The Regents of the University of California on Behalf of the University of California, Riverside (UCR)

Mrs. Lynn Carmen Day, Chief Academic Officer, shared that the STEM Partnership Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), to be signed by Dr. David Hansen, District Superintendent (RUSD) and Kim Wilcox, Chancellor (UCR), would create a partnership to promote, foster, and enrich the pre-college math and science environment, and stimulate greater student interests in math, science, and engineering at the Riverside STEM Academy.

2. Early College High School Memorandum of Understanding Between Riverside Unified School District (RUSD) and Riverside Community College District (RCCD) on Behalf of Riverside City College (RCC)

Mrs. Carmen Day noted that the Early College High School Memorandum of

Mrs. Carmen Day noted that the Early College High School Memorandum of Understanding, to be signed by Dr. David Hansen, District Superintendent and Dr. Isaac Wolde-Ab, President of Riverside City College, would allow students to earn both a high school diploma and up to two (2) years of college credits towards an Associate degree. President Wolde-Ab and Dr. Hansen shared comments supporting the MOU.

Provost Paul D'Anieri, Chancellor Wilcox, RCC President Dr. Wolde-Ab, Dr. Hansen, Board President Mrs. Allavie and the Board of Education shared comments supporting the Partnership MOU between RUSD and UCR and the MOU between RUSD and RCC.

The following individuals spoke in support of the MOUs: RCC Board of Trustees President Virginia Blumenthal; Mrs. Sue Johnson, former UC Regent; Ms. Clarissa Cervantes, Assistant to Councilmember Melendrez; and Mr. Gordon Bourns.

He suggested that we set up a virtual idea box, a link on the website, maybe a suggestion box at every school site to get more community input. He would like us to create a video that is very user-friendly about the General Obligation Bond to receive the input we are looking for in regards to the FMP similar to the one produced for the SBAC testing results.

Mrs. Cloud thanked Dr. Hansen for representing RUSD so well at the last Good Morning Riverside meeting. She reported that the Instruction Subcommittee meeting was held last week and that it was very informative and also that the District VAPA Plan would be coming forward soon. She shared an article from *The Press-Enterprise* titled, "Becoming America the not-so-beautiful" that she would like to have shared with the other Board members.

Mrs. Allavie stated that after hearing all of the information tonight, she is favoring the General Obligation Bond on the November election ballot. She indicated that this is mostly based on the tight timeline that we have to work with. She said that she is very optimistic about our partnership with UCR and feels like it is now our turn to put the plans in place to have a high school on the UCR campus.

DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:

It is necessary to dispose of electronic equipment which has become obsolete, is not cost effective to repair or no longer holds any value for replacement parts. Items in this condition must be declared surplus and disposed of in accordance with California Education Code and environmental regulations designed to protect the environment from electronic waste (e-waste).

In accordance with the California Education Code §17546, the items may be sold at private sale without advertising if the value of the item(s) are under \$2,500 as unanimously approved by the Board. If it is found the property is of insufficient value to defray costs of arranging a sale, the property may be sold, donated or disposed of in a public dump. Given the environmental regulations associated to the disposition of electronic equipment, disposal in the public dump is not an option. Sale of electronic equipment shall be limited to state certified e-waste collection facilities.

California Education Code §17547 requires that monies received from the sale shall be placed to the credit of the fund from which the original expenditure for the purchase of the property was made or in the general or reserve fund of the district.

FISCAL IMPACT: None

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education declare listed electronic equipment as surplus and authorize staff to sell or dispose of the surplus electronic equipment in accordance with Education Code provisions.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Riverside Unified School District, in order to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 60119 held a public hearing on October 5, 2015, at 5:30 o'clock, which is on or before the eighth week of school (between the first day that students attend school and the eighth week from that day) and did not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board provided at least 10 days notice of the public hearing posted in at least three public places within the district that stated the time, place, and purpose of the hearing, and;

WHEREAS, the governing board encouraged participation by parents, teachers, members of the community, and bargaining unit leaders in the public hearing, and;

WHEREAS, information provided at the public hearing and to the governing board at the public meeting detailed the extent to which textbooks and instructional materials were provided to all students, including English learners, in the district, and;

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home, and;

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks and instructional materials were provided to each student, including English learners, that are aligned to the academic content standards and are consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks in mathematics, science, history-social science, and English/language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program, and;

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials were provided to each pupil enrolled in foreign language or health classes, and;

WHEREAS, laboratory science equipment was available for science laboratory classes offered in grades 9-12, inclusive;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to California Education Code Section 60119, for the 2015-16 school year, the Riverside Unified School District has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks.

In the 2015-2016 academic year, California State University, San Bernardino ("CSUSB") will celebrate 50 years of service to the people and communities of San Bernardino and Riverside counties, including students, faculty, and staff of Riverside Unified School District ("RUSD").

Over the last 50 years, RUSD and CSUSB have collaborated on research projects and professional development initiatives; coordinated field experience placements of teaching/counseling/administrative credential candidates; partnered to guarantee CSUSB admissions to RUSD students who meet certain minimum requirements; and, most recently, combined resources to fund the enrollment of seventy-six (76) students from RUSD in CSUSB's Coyote First STEP program, a student transition program designed to enhance social connections among students, forge a sense of belonging on CSUSB's campus and help ensure students get on a solid footing for timely graduation.

In recognition of CSUSBs many years of partnership with RUSD, staff is putting forth the attached resolution for approval. The resolution will be a part of CSUSB's anniversary festivities which will have a kick-off by Dr. Tomás D. Morales, president of California State University, San Bernardino, at CSUSB's Fall Convocation.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE RIVERSIDE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT COMMEMORATING THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, SAN BERNARDINO

WHEREAS, 2015 commemorates the half-century year that California State University, San Bernardino was first established in 1965 as California State College at San Bernardino to provide educational opportunities for the growing population of the Inland Empire of California; and

WHEREAS, in 1960, California Governor Edmund G. (Pat) Brown signed the California Master Plan for Higher Education and California State Senator Stanford Shaw introduced legislation to formally create San Bernardino-Riverside State College; and

WHEREAS, the renamed California State College at San Bernardino officially opened in the fall of 1965 with 293 students, including 90 freshmen, and a faculty and staff of 93 and officially changed its name to California State University, San Bernardino in 1984; and

WHEREAS, from these modest beginnings, California State University, San Bernardino has matured into a comprehensive university, offering highly-respected bachelor's, master's and doctoral academic programs in five colleges and multiple departments to more than 20,000 students annually; and

WHEREAS, California State University, San Bernardino ranks seventh in the nation in the Education to Career College Rankings Index in terms of improving the earnings and attainment of quality employment of its students; and

WHEREAS, California State University, San Bernardino has had a significant economic, technological, social and environmental impact on the Inland Empire, producing more than 80,000 alumni during its first half-century; and

WHEREAS, California State University, San Bernardino has contributed to the rich economic life and culture of the State of California by providing nearly 4,000 graduates into the workforce each year; and

WHEREAS, California State University, San Bernardino's impact generates more than a half a billion dollars on the statewide economy and more than \$30 million in statewide annual tax revenue; and,

WHEREAS, the California State University, San Bernardino impact sustains more than 2,000 jobs in the Inland Empire and 4,700 jobs statewide; and

WHEREAS, California State University, San Bernardino is a cherished educational home for U.S. military veterans, ranking first in California and ninth nationally as a 2015 "Best for Vets" campus by *Military Times*; and

WHEREAS, California State University, San Bernardino's faculty contribute to the quality of life in the Nation by their active engagement in scholarship, research, technological innovation, community service, and the arts; and

WHEREAS, California State University, San Bernardino has been named every year to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll, the highest federal recognition a college or university can receive for its commitment to volunteering, service-learning, and civic engagement; and

WHEREAS, California State University, San Bernardino is an active partner with Riverside Unified School District (and other educational institutions), industries, and communities to enhance the quality of education, research, development, and community service for the Inland Empire, Coachella Valley, and the State of California;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the Riverside Unified School District honors California State University, San Bernardino for its 50 years of commitment to public higher education.

On May 3, 2010 the Riverside Unified School District Board of Education passed a resolution electing to become a "School District of Choice" and participate in the state's alternative interdistrict attendance program. This program allows students residing outside of the District's boundaries to be admitted to District schools and remain enrolled in District schools from year to year, subject to certain limitations. Applications for interdistrict attendance must be submitted within a window period, which ends prior to January 1 of the school year preceding the school year for which the student is requesting to be transferred. If the number of transfer applications exceeds the number of transfers the Board elects to accept, an approval for transfer must be determined by a random drawing held in public at a regularly-scheduled meeting of the Board.

WHEREAS, On May 3, 2010, the Riverside Unified School District Board of Education favorably voted to participate in the SB 680 District of Choice Program; and

WHEREAS, Districts participating in the SB 680 District of Choice Program are required to report the number of available spaces for District of Choice applicants. California Education code 48301 requires that a District participating in this program determines and adopts the number of transfers it is willing to accept under this article, and ensures that pupils admitted under the policy are selected through a random, unbiased process that prohibits an evaluation of whether or not the pupil should be enrolled based upon his or her academic or athletic performance.

WHEREAS, the Governing Board has determined that the available spaces for District of Choice transfers for 2015-2016 in the Riverside Unified School District are as follows:

Kindergarten through Fifth Grade – 300 openings

Sixth through Eighth Grade – 300 openings

Ninth through Twelfth Grade – 100 openings

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the number of students admitted from other school districts pursuant to the District of Choice Program for attendance during the 2015-2016 school year will not exceed the number of available spaces set forth herein. If the number of applications exceeds the number of spaces available for transfers, a lottery will be conducted as described in pertinent Board Policy, consistent with applicable law.

POLICY

Board of Education Riverside Unified School District

Conduct

PURPOSE: The purpose of this policy is to clarify the district's expectations with respect to

student conduct.

POSITION: The Governing Board Board of Education believes that all students have the right

to be educated in a positive learning environment free from disruptions. To maintain such an environment, students, parents/guardians, staff and the Board all

must understand and fulfill their responsibility related to student conduct.

1. Students shall be expected to exhibit appropriate conduct that does not infringe upon the rights of others or interfere with the school program while on school grounds, going to or coming from school, at school activities, or using district transportation.

1.1.2. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that each school develops standards of conduct and discipline consistent with Board policies and administrative regulations.

4.3.Students and parents/guardians shall be notified of district and school rules related to conduct.

Student Responsibilities

- 2.4. The Board believes that it is important for students to understand that they have a choice to make regarding their actions and that appropriate conduct benefits both themselves and others. Students are encouraged to freely express their individuality as long as this expression does not infringe upon the rights of others or interfere with the instructional program. Behavior is considered appropriate when students are diligent in study, neat and clean, careful with school property, respectful towards their teachers, and courteous to other students, staff and volunteers. Students are expected to be punctual and regular in attendance and to remain on school premises in accordance with school rules. They are further expected to refrain from profane, vulgar or abusive language.
- 5. Students shall receive the district and school rules and regulations related to conduct.
 Students who violate these rules and regulations may be subject to discipline, suspension, exclusion, expulsion or transfer to alternative programs.
- 6. Prohibited student conduct includes, but is not limited to:
- 7. Conduct that endangers students, staff, or others, including but not limited to, physical violence, possession of a firearm or other weapon, and terrorist threats
- 8. Discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying of students or staff, including sexual harassment, hate-motivated behavior, cyberbullying, hazing or initiation activity, extortion, or any other verbal, written, or physical conduct that causes or threatens to cause violence, bodily harm, or substantial disruption
- 9. Conduct that disrupts the orderly belonging to students, staff, or the district
- 10. Willful defiance of staff's authority
- 11. Damage to or theft of property belonging to students, staff, or the district
- 12. The district shall not be responsible to students, staff, or the district which are brought on campus or to a school activity and are lost, stolen, or damaged.
- 13. Obscene acts or use of profane, vulgar, or abusive language
- 14. Possession, use, or being under the influence of tobacco, alcohol, or other prohibited

drugs

- 15. Possession or use of a laser pointer, unless for a valid instructional or other school-related purpose (Penal Code 417.27)
- 16. Prior to bringing a laser pointer on school premises for a valid instructional or other school-related purpose, a student shall obtain permission from the principal or designee.
- 17. Use of a cellular/digital telephone, pager, or other mobile communications device during instructional time
- 18. Such devices shall be turned off in class, except when being used for a valid instructional or other school-related purpose as determined by the teacher or other district employee, and at any other time directed by a district employee. Any device with camera, video, or voice recording function shall not be used in any manner which infringes on the privacy rights of any other person.
- 19. No student shall be prohibited from possessing or using an electronic signaling device that is determined by a licensed physician or surgeon to be essential for the student's health and the use of which is limited to purposes related to the student's health. (Education Code 48901.5)
- 20. Plagiarism or dishonesty on school work or tests
- 21. Inappropriate attire
- 22. Tardiness or unexcused absence from school
- 23. Failure to remain on school premises in accordance with school rules
- 24. Employees are expected to provide appropriate supervision to enforce standards of conduct and, if they observe or receive a report of a violation of these standards, to immediately intervene or call for assistance.
- 25. If an employee believes a matter has not been resolved, he/she shall refer the matter to his/her supervisor or an administrator for further investigation.
- 26. When a school official suspects that a search of a student or his/her belongings will turn up evidence of the student's violation of the law or school rules, such a search shall be conducted in accordance with BP 5145.12- Search and Seizure.
- 27. When a student uses any prohibited device, or uses a permitted device in any unethical or illegal activity, a district employee may confiscate the device.
- 1.1.1.28. The employee shall store the item in a secure manner until an appropriate time.
- 3.29. Students who violate district or school rules and regulations may be subject to discipline including, but not limited to suspension, expulsion, transfer to alternative programs, referral to a student success team or counseling services, or denial of participation in extracurricular or co-curricular activities or other privileges in accordance with Board policy and administrative regulation. The Superintendent or designee shall notify local law enforcement as appropriate. Students also may be subject to discipline, in accordance with law, Board policy, or administrative regulation, for any off-campus conduct during non-school hours which poses a threat or danger to the safety of students, staff, or district property, or substantially disrupts school activities.

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities

- 4.30. Parents/guardians are expected to comply with laws governing the conduct and education of their children and to cooperate with school authorities regarding their children's behavior.
- 5.31. California law holds parents/guardians liable for any willful student misconduct which results in the death or injury of any student or persons employed by or volunteering for the district. Parents/guardians are also liable for any defacement, injury or loss of property belonging to the district or to a school employee.
- 6.32. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that parents/guardians are annually

- informed of their liability for death, personal injury or district property damage resulting from willful student misconduct.
- 1.1.2.33. Parents/guardians shall also be informed that the district shall not be responsible for damage caused by any student to any item of personal property which another student brings to school.

District Responsibilities

- 7.34. The Board is responsible for prescribing behavioral and disciplinary guidelines for students. The Board shall give staff all reasonable support with respect to enforcing appropriate student conduct and discipline.
- 8.35. The Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures necessary to enforce the Board's conduct and discipline policies and shall notify parents/guardians of the availability of these policies and procedures at the beginning of each school year.

The school principal shall establish and enforce school rules that conform with district-procedures and that foster safety and good citizenship. He/she shall ensure that students are informed of these rules when they enroll and at the beginning of each school year.

9.36. Teachers shall establish and enforce classroom rules that facilitate safety and effective learning. They shall cooperate with other certificated staff in enforcing general school rules and helping students to understand the benefits of choosing behaviors that show respect for other people and property.

POLICY

Board of Education Riverside Unified School District

AntiBullying

PURPOSE: The purpose of this policy is to clarify the district's expectations with respect to

bullying.

POSITION: Governing Board recognizes the harmful effects of bullying on student learning and

school attendance and desires to provide safe school environments that protect students from physical and emotional harm. The Riverside Unified School District believes that all students have a right to a safe and healthy school environment. To that end, the District, schools, and community have an obligation to promote mutual respect, tolerance, and acceptance. The District will not tolerate behavior that infringes on the safety of any student. A student shall not intimidate or harass another student through words or actions. Such behavior includes direct physical contact, such as hitting or shoving; verbal assaults, such as teasing, name-calling, threats, harassment or using insults, slurs, or fighting words which, by their very nature, are disruptive to the school environment made in person or via the internet or cellular telephone text messages; and, social isolation or manipulation. This policy applies whenever a student is on school grounds; traveling to and from school or a school sponsored activity; during the lunch period, whether on or off-campus; and during a school sponsored activity.

- 1.11. District employees shall establish student safety as a high priority and shall not tolerate bullying of any student.
- No individual or group shall, through physical, written, verbal, or other means, harass, sexually harass, threaten, intimidate, retaliate, cyberbully, cause bodily injury to, or commit hate violence against any student or school personnel. Students who act in violation of this policy may be subject to school/District disciplinary procedures up to and including expulsion.
- 3. Cyberbullying includes the creation or transmission of harassing communications, direct threats, or other harmful texts, sounds, or images on the Internet, social media, or other technologies using a telephone, computer, or any wireless communication device.
- 4. Cyberbullying also includes breaking into another person's electronic account and assuming that person's identity in order to damage that person's reputation.
- 5. Strategies for addressing bullying in district schools shall be developed with involvement of key stakeholders, including students, parent/guardians, and staff, and shall be incorporated into the comprehensive safety plan, the local control and accountability plan, and other applicable district and school plans.
- 6. As appropriate, the Superintendent or designee may collaborate with law enforcement, courts, social services, mental health services, other agencies, and community organizations in the development and implementation of joint strategies to promote safety in schools and the community and to provide services for alleged victims and perpetrators of bullying.

BULLYING PREVENTION

7. To the extent possible, district schools shall focus on the prevention of bullying by establishing clear rules for student conduct and implementing strategies to promote a positive, collaborative school climate.

- 8. Students shall be informed, through student handbooks and other appropriate means, of district and school rules related to bullying, mechanisms available for reporting incidents or threats, and the consequences for engaging in bullying.
- 9. As appropriate, the district shall provide students with instruction, in the classroom or other educational settings, that promotes effective communication and conflict resolution skills, social skills, character/values education, respect for cultural and individual indifferences, self-esteem development, assertiveness skills, and appropriate online behavior.
- 10. Staff shall receive related professional development, including information about early warning signs of harassing/intimidating behaviors and effective prevention and intervention strategies.
- 11. Based on an assessment of bullying incidents at school, the Superintendent or designee may increase supervision and security in areas where bullying most often occurs, such as classrooms, playgrounds, hallways, restrooms, and cafeterias.

INTERVENTION

- 12. Students are encouraged to notify school staff when they are being bullied or suspect that another student is being victimized.
- 13. In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall develop means for students to report threats or incidents confidentially and anonymously.
- 14. School staff who witness an act of bullying shall immediately intervene to stop the incident when it is safe to do so. (Education Code 234.1)
- 15. When appropriate the Superintendent or designee shall notify the parents/guardians of victims and perpetrators and may contact law enforcement.
- 16. The Superintendent, principal, or principal's designee may refer a victim, witness, perpetrator, or other student affected by an act of bullying to a school counselor, school psychologist, social worker, child welfare attendance personnel, school nurse, or other school support service personnel for case management, counseling, and/or participation in a restorative justice program as appropriate. (Education Code 48900.9)

COMPLAINTS AND INVESTIGATION

- 17. Any student, parent/guardian, or other individual who believes that a student has been subjected to bullying or who has witnessed bullying may report the incident to a teacher, principal, assistant principal, counselor, pupil services administrator, or any other available school employee.
- 18. Within one business day of receiving such a report, a staff member shall notify the principal of the report, whether or not a bully complaint is filed.
- 19. Within two business days of receiving a report of bullying, the principal shall notify the Assistant Director of Pupil Services.
- 20. In addition, any school employee who observes an incident of bullying involving a student shall, within one business day, report his/her observation to the principal or a district Pupil Services Administrator, whether or not the alleged victim files a complaint.
- 21. When the circumstances involve cyberbullying, individuals with information about the activity shall be encouraged to save and print any electronic or digital messages that they feel constitute cyberbullying and to notify a teacher, the principal, or other employee so that the matter may be investigated.
- 22. When a student uses a social networking site or service to bully or harass another student, the Superintendent or designee may file a request with the networking site or service to suspend the privileges of the student and to have the material removed.

- 23. When a report of bullying is submitted, the principal or Pupil Services Administrator shall inform the student or parent/guardian of the right to file a formal written bullying complaint.
- 24. All complaint of bullying, whether written or oral, formal or informal, shall be investigated and resolved in accordance with law and the district's bullying complaint procedures.
- 25. The student who is the alleged victim of the bullying shall be given an opportunity to describe the incident, identify witnesses who may have relevant information, and provide other evidence of bullying.

DISCIPLINE

- 26. Corrective actions for a student who commits and act of bullying of any type may include counseling, behavioral intervention and education, and, if the behavior is severe or pervasive as defined in Education Code 48900, may include suspension or expulsion in accordance with district policies and regulations.
- 27. Misconduct subject to the jurisdiction of the district includes, but is not limited to, off campus bullying that causes or is likely to cause a substantial disruption of a school activity or attendance.
- 1.28. Any employee who permits or engages in bullying or retaliation related to bullying shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

WHEREAS, the Riverside Unified School District has an obligation to afford all persons in public schools equal rights and the responsibility to provide equal educational opportunities, regardless of race, color, creed, national origin, ethnicity, gender, language, sexual orientation, gender identity, physical or mental disability, political or religious theology, physical appearance or economic status that is contained in the California Education Code 200-262.2; and

WHEREAS, the Riverside Unified School District has historically recognized the need to adopt curriculum specifically to use in classrooms in order to teach pupils how to appreciate diversity and to discourage the development of discriminatory attitudes and practices; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Riverside Unified School District has adopted Board Policy 5131.2, entitled *Bullying*, which states, in part, "District employees shall establish student safety as a high priority and shall not tolerate bullying of any student; and

WHEREAS, no individual or group shall, through physical, written, verbal, or other means, harass, sexually harass, threaten, intimidate, retaliate, cyberbully, cause bodily injury to, or commit hate violence against any student or school personnel"; and

POLICY

Board of Education Riverside Unified School District

Nondiscrimination in District Programs and Activities

PURPOSE: The purpose of this policy is to clarify the district's expectations with respect to

nondiscrimination of students in schools and school activities.

POSITION: The Governing Board is committed to equal opportunity for all individuals.

- 1.1.1. District programs, activities, and practices shall be free from discrimination based on race, color, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, or genetic information; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics. District programs and activities shall be free from discrimination based on sex, race, color, religion, national origin, ethnic group, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability or any other unlawful consideration.
- 2. Annually, the Superintendent or designee shall review district programs and activities to ensure the removal of any barrier that may unlawfully prevent an individual or group in any of the protected categories stated above from accessing district programs and activities, including the use of facilities. The Board shall promote programs which ensure that discriminatory practices are eliminated in all district activities.
- 1.2.3. The Superintendent or designee shall take prompt, reasonable actions to remove any identified barrier. The Superintendent or designee shall report his/her findings and recommendations to the Board after each review.
- 4. Pursuant to 34 CFR 104.8 and 34 CFR 106.9, the Superintendent or designee shall notify students, parents/guardians, employees, employee organizations, applicants for admission and employment, and sources of referral for applicants about the district's policy on nondiscrimination and related complaint procedures. District programs and facilities, viewed in their entirety, shall be readily accessible to individuals with handicaps.
- 1.3.5. Such notification shall be included in each announcement, bulletin, catalog, handbook, application form, or other materials distributed to these groups.
- 6. The district's nondiscrimination policy and related informational materials shall be published in a format that parents/guardians can understand. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that interested persons, including those with impaired vision and hearing, may upon request, obtain information about programs, facilities and activities available to them.
- 1.4.7. In addition, when 15 percent or more of a school's students speak a single primary language other than English, those materials shall be translated into that other language.
- 1.5.8. District programs and facilities, viewed in their entirety, shall be in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and any implementing standards and/or regulations. Title VI mandates that prior to the beginning of each school year, recipients of federal funds advise students, parent/guardians and the general public that all vocational opportunities shall be

offered without regard to race, color, national origin, sex or handicap.

- 9. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the district provides appropriate auxiliary aids and services when necessary to afford individuals with disabilities equal opportunity to participate in or enjoy the benefits of a service, program, or activity. Pursuant to Title VI, if the district serves a community of Limited English speaking persons, the notification must also be published in the language of that community and include a statement that lack of English skills shall not be a barrier to participation in vocational education programs.
- 1.6.10. These aids and services may include, but are not limited to, qualified interpreters or readers, assistive listening devices, notetakers, written materials, taped text, and Braille or large print materials.
- 11. Individuals with disabilities shall notify the Superintendent or principal if they have a disability that requires special assistance or services. As required by law, the Superintendent or designee shall notify students and parents/guardians of the district's policy on nondiscrimination and related complaint procedure.
- 1.7.12. Reasonable notification should be given prior to the school-sponsored function, program, or meeting.
