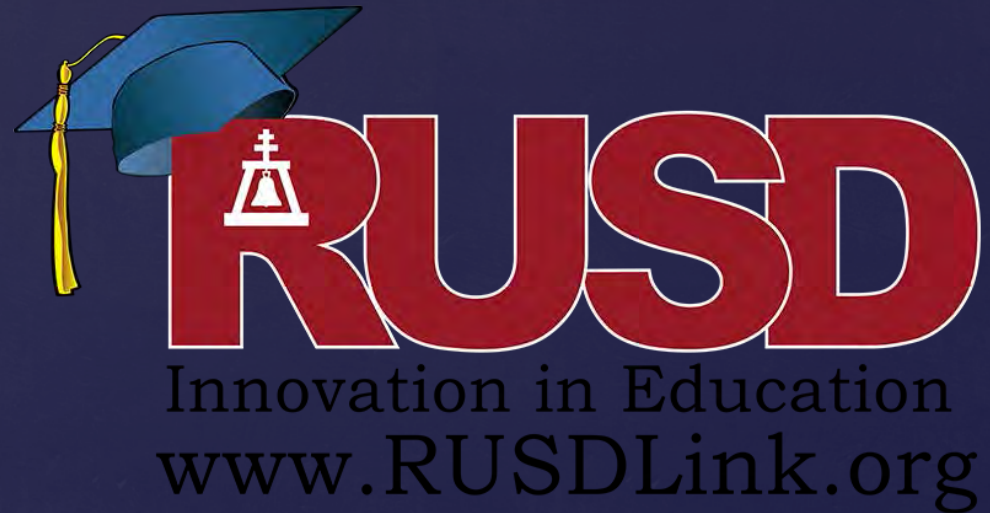

- The majority of deaths and injuries in pools and spas involve children ages one and two, and occur in residential settings.
- Drowning occur when there is a short lapse in adult supervision.
- Young children drown quickly and silently.
- Last year alone ten children drowned in Riverside County.
- On average, the City of Riverside Fire Department has thirty eight responses per year, resulting in five deaths, and twenty five hospitalizations.

SECTION A – DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORT

Dr. Hansen’s shared that this Friday would mark one month until the first day of the beginning of school for RUSD. He noted that RUSD staff has been busy preparing to make this next school year the best one yet for our students. He discussed the August 19 Professional Development event for all employees. Dr. Hansen mentioned last week’s Global Summit featuring the EdTech Team and Google for Education held at Riverside Polytechnic High School which was an interactive two-day summit focused on deploying, integrating, and using Google’s technology to promote student learning in K-12 education.

Dr. Kirk Lewis, Assistant Superintendent, Operations, provided an update on the STEM Academy reviewing on-site parking expansion that would be provided. He shared information about two meetings that were held with parents. He discussed the growth of the program and how it has impacted the neighborhood, and the steps staff is taking to address the concerns of the residents.

Dr. Hansen concluded with sharing information about the RUSD Coaches Clinic which will be held on August 15 at the Riverside Convention Center. He also discussed a recent meeting he had with Mrs. Mays Kakish, Chief Business Officer, and Mr. Ron Bennett, CEO of School Services of California, to address the Board of Education’s

Short Description: Requesting approval to declare listed electronic equipment as surplus property and authorization to sell or dispose of the surplus electronic equipment in accordance with Education Code provisions.

DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:

It is necessary to dispose of electronic equipment which has become obsolete, is not cost effective to repair or no longer holds any value for replacements parts. Items in this condition must be declared surplus and disposed of in accordance with California Education Code and environmental regulations designed to protect the environment from electronic waste (e-waste).

In accordance with the California Education Code §17546, the items may be sold at private sale without advertising if the value of the item(s) are under \$2,500 as unanimously approved by the board. If it is found the property is of insufficient value to defray costs of arranging a sale, the property may be sold, donated or disposed of in a public dump. Given the environmental regulations associated to the disposition of electronic equipment, disposal in the public dump is not an option. Sale of electronic equipment shall be limited to state certified e-waste collection facilities.

California Education Code §17547 requires that monies received from the sale shall be placed to the credit of the fund from which the original expenditure for the purchase of the property was made or in the general or reserve fund of the district.

FISCAL IMPACT: None

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education declare listed electronic equipment as surplus and authorize staff to sell or dispose of surplus electronic equipment in accordance with Education Code provisions.

b. The contractor agrees to cooperate fully in providing reasonable access to the contractor's records, documents, agents or employees, or premises if reasonably required by authorized officials of the contracting agency, the Department of Industrial Relations,

or the Department of Justice to determine the contractor's compliance with the requirements under paragraph (a).

7. DOMESTIC PARTNERS: For contracts over \$100,000 executed or amended after January 1, 2007, the contractor certifies that contractor is in compliance with Public Contract Code section 10295.3.

DOING BUSINESS WITH THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

The following laws apply to persons or entities doing business with the State of California.

1. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: Contractor needs to be aware of the following provisions regarding current or former state employees. If Contractor has any questions on the status of any person rendering services or involved with the Agreement, the awarding agency must be contacted immediately for clarification.

Current State Employees (Pub. Contract Code §10410):

- 1). No officer or employee shall engage in any employment, activity or enterprise from which the officer or employee receives compensation or has a financial interest and which is sponsored or funded by any state agency, unless the employment, activity or enterprise is required as a condition of regular state employment.
- 2). No officer or employee shall contract on his or her own behalf as an independent contractor with any state agency to provide goods or services.

Former State Employees (Pub. Contract Code §10411):

- 1). For the two-year period from the date he or she left state employment, no former state officer or employee may enter into a contract in which he or she engaged in any of the negotiations, transactions, planning, arrangements or any part of the decision-making process relevant to the contract while employed in any capacity by any state agency.
- 2). For the twelve-month period from the date he or she left state employment, no former state officer or employee may enter into a contract with any state agency if he or she was employed by that state agency in a policy-making position in the same general subject area as the proposed contract within the 12-month period prior to his or her leaving state service.

If Contractor violates any provisions of above paragraphs, such action by Contractor shall render this Agreement void. (Pub. Contract Code §10420)

Members of boards and commissions are exempt from this section if they do not receive payment other than payment of each meeting of the board or commission, payment for preparatory time and payment for per diem. (Pub. Contract Code §10430 (e))

2. LABOR CODE/WORKERS' COMPENSATION: Contractor needs to be aware of the provisions which require every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions, and Contractor affirms to comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement. (Labor Code Section 3700)

3. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT: Contractor assures the State that it complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability, as well as all applicable regulations and guidelines issued pursuant to the ADA. (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.)

4. CONTRACTOR NAME CHANGE: An amendment is required to change the Contractor's name as listed on this Agreement. Upon receipt of legal documentation of the name change the State will process the amendment. Payment of invoices presented with a new name cannot be paid prior to approval of said amendment.

5. CORPORATE QUALIFICATIONS TO DO BUSINESS IN CALIFORNIA:

a. When agreements are to be performed in the state by corporations, the contracting agencies will be verifying that the contractor is currently qualified to do business in California in order to ensure that all obligations due to the state are fulfilled.

b. "Doing business" is defined in R&TC Section 23101 as actively engaging in any transaction for the purpose of financial or pecuniary gain or profit. Although there are some statutory exceptions to taxation, rarely will a corporate contractor performing within the state not be subject to the franchise tax.

c. Both domestic and foreign corporations (those incorporated outside of California) must be in good standing in order to be qualified to do business in California. Agencies will determine whether a corporation is in good standing by calling the Office of the Secretary of State.

6. RESOLUTION: A county, city, district, or other local public body must provide the State with a copy of a resolution, order, motion, or ordinance of the local governing body which by law has authority to enter into an agreement, authorizing execution of the agreement.

7. AIR OR WATER POLLUTION VIOLATION: Under the State laws, the Contractor shall not be: (1) in violation of any order or resolution not subject to review promulgated by the State Air Resources Board or an air pollution control district; (2) subject to cease and desist order not subject to review issued pursuant to Section 13301 of the Water Code for violation of waste discharge requirements or discharge prohibitions; or (3) finally determined to be in violation of provisions of federal law relating to air or water pollution.

8. PAYEE DATA RECORD FORM STD. 204: This form must be completed by all contractors that are not another state agency or other governmental entity.

CERTIFICATIONS REGARDING LOBBYING; DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS; AND DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should refer to the regulations cited below to determine the certification to which they are required to attest. Applicants should also review the instructions for certification included in the regulations before completing this form. (c) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all subawards at all tiers (including subgrants, contracts under grants and cooperative agreements, and subcontracts) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

2. DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS

As required by executive Order 12549, Debarment and Suspension, and other responsibilities implemented at 45 CFR Part 76, for prospective participants in primary or a lower tier covered transactions, as defined at 45 CFR Part 76, Sections 76.105 and 76.110.

A. The applicant certifies that it and its principals:

(a) Are not presently debarred, suspended proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any federal department or agency:

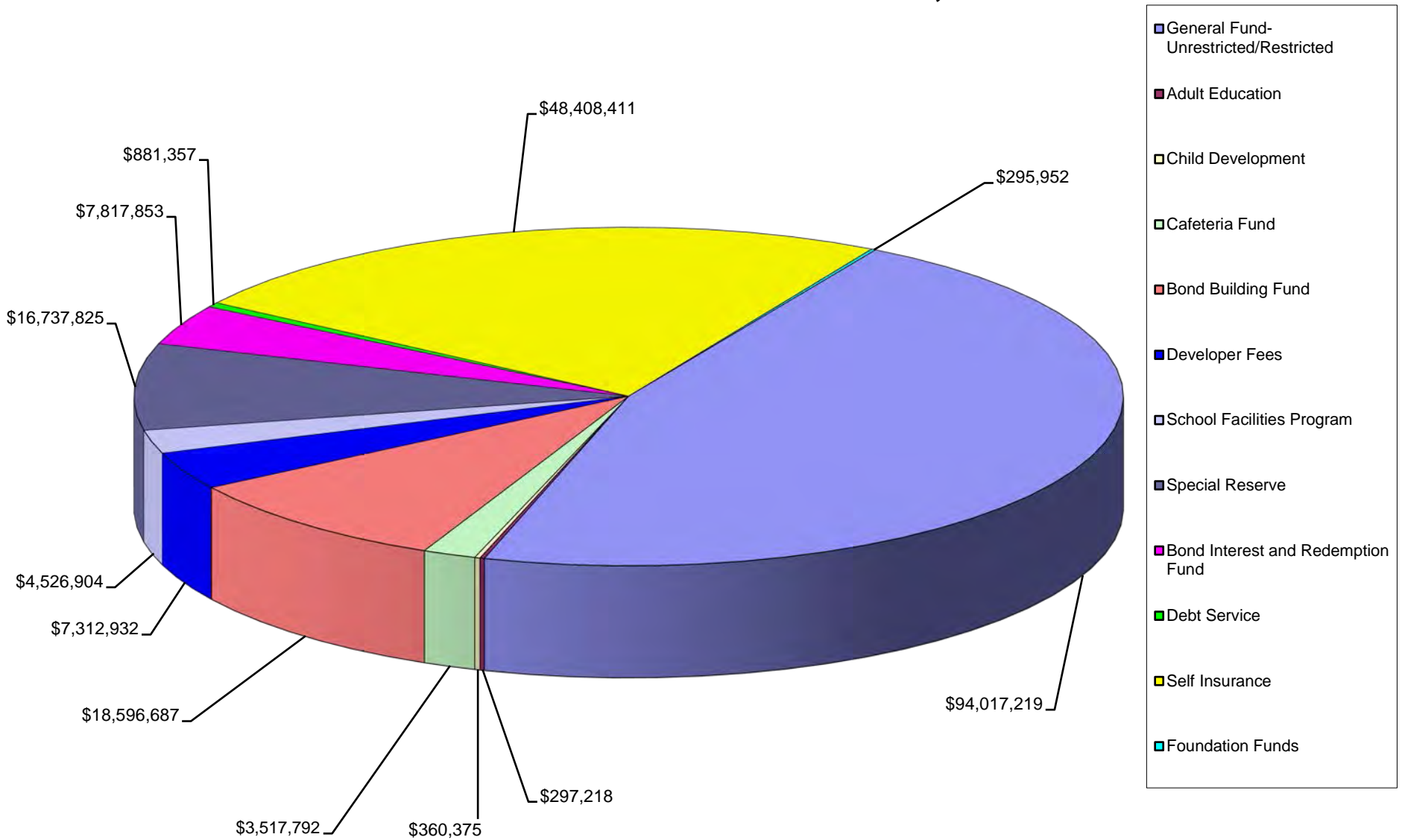

“The Grey Swans of Summer”

With the summer of 2015 now in full swing, a number of so-called grey swans, or events with potential to have a sizable impact on the health of the financial markets have presented themselves. They range from the Grexit, or the Greek exit from the Euro, a Chinese stock market meltdown, continued Middle East tensions, cyber terrorism and an emboldened Russia.

While all eyes at the moment remain firmly fixed on Greece, as well as when the FED may start to raise short term rates, a potentially much more significant financial event is developing to the east. Yet the theater of the Greek debt talks, together with will they or won't they leave the euro has relegated the China story to little more than a scrolling headline. More than a third of Chinese listed companies have now suspended trading on their main equity indices due to a 30% loss in value since June, largely fueled by borrowed money (margin investing); additionally, a real estate bubble has also played a major role in this outbreak of speculative excess.

China has packed more development into a few short decades than any country in recorded history before it, thus creating worldwide excesses in industrial capacity that even global demand is struggling to deal with. Their stock market boom has only succeeded in adding debt. As we all know, the damage done in financial crises is not just the crash itself as far as equity valuations are concerned, but also by a collapsing banking sector. Whether any of this turns into contagion depends on the government's response, but we can see little evidence for China's political leaders as having the situation under control, at least at this juncture.

Meanwhile, the front page news of late was Greek voters rejecting their creditors' proposed economic reforms. Polls ahead of the referendum suggested that voters would accept and swallow some medicine, but the "no" vote prevailed. They have been left with little choice; default on its July 20th \$3.9 billion payment to the ECB and become a failed state subject to social chaos, or, go along with the reforms to keep Greece in the European Union (EU). Both parties have a strong interest to remain in the EU, and negotiations may resume but yet trust between the parties has so eroded that cooperation could fail. The fallout may see bond yields rise for the other big debtor nations of Europe including Portugal, Italy and Spain while the euro and equity markets will weaken.

U.S. equity markets have seen some selling as a spillover from the drama as a result. In the longer term, the strength of the U.S.

dollar and safety appeal of Treasuries, as well as other G7 markets, will probably continue to attract investors looking for perceived safe havens.

Over the past several FOMC meetings, Chairman Janet Yellen has hinted on numerous occasions that the FED will begin increasing the overnight lending rate sometime in 2015. They actually started the process of priming the markets last October by ending QE3, or the third rendition of the quantitative easing programs which induced massive amounts of liquidity into the financial markets. The FED has now turned its focus towards the near zero level of the FED funds rate. Yellen has been adamant that the Federal Reserve has been watching the data closely to determine the appropriate timing of short term rate increases. One of the important factors for continued economic expansion, and required to offset any drag caused by tighter monetary policy, is an increasing rate of wage growth to support expansion in spending as our economy is almost 70% driven by consumption.

According to data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), the U.S. labor force totals about 157 million people. The June BLS report states that 8.3 million of our citizens were unemployed, 6.5 million were working part time but wanted a full-time job and 1.9 million were marginally attached, meaning not employed but would likely take a full-time job if available. That means nearly 10.6% of the labor force in the U.S. are either unemployed or under-employed and partially helps to explain why wages are not rising as much as many desire.

Last week's employment report should help shed some light on the mindset of the FED as it showed wage growth is minimal and the supply of labor is larger than most realize. Under these conditions, the FED shouldn't be in a hurry to raise rates but being caught zero bound leaves few options for them whenever another slowdown or recession occurs. Indeed, Yellen & Co. has their hands full and has a very difficult challenge ahead, kind of like being caught between a rock and a hard place. We will be prepared for whatever eventuality comes our way in terms of interest rates and the TPIF.

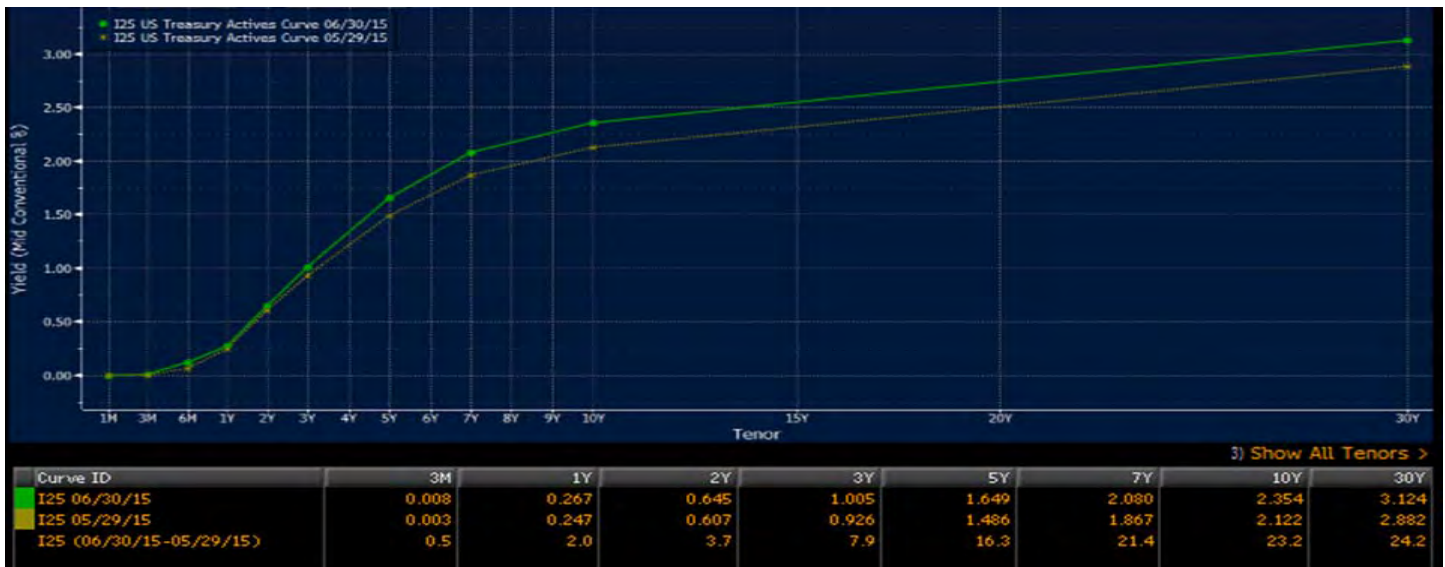

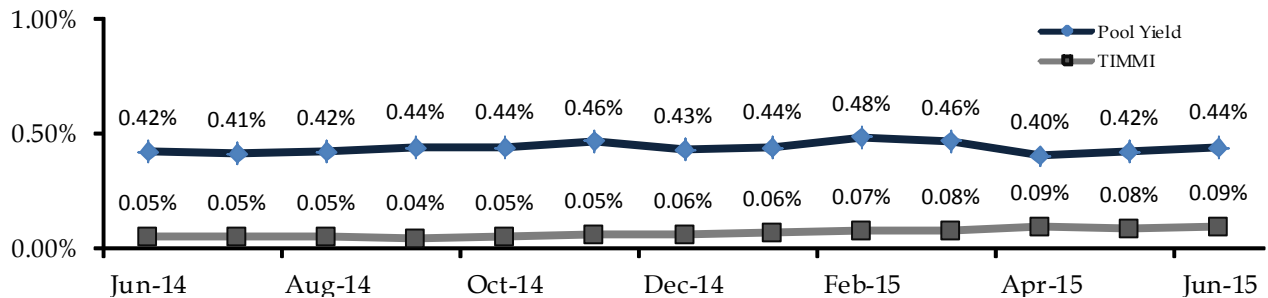
US Treasury Curve (M/M)

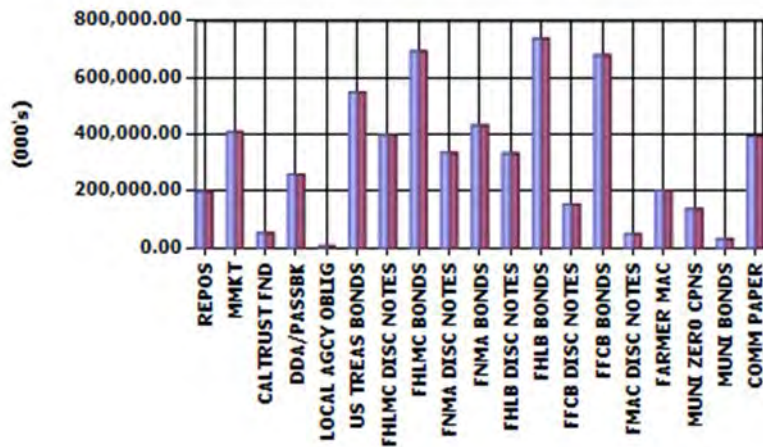

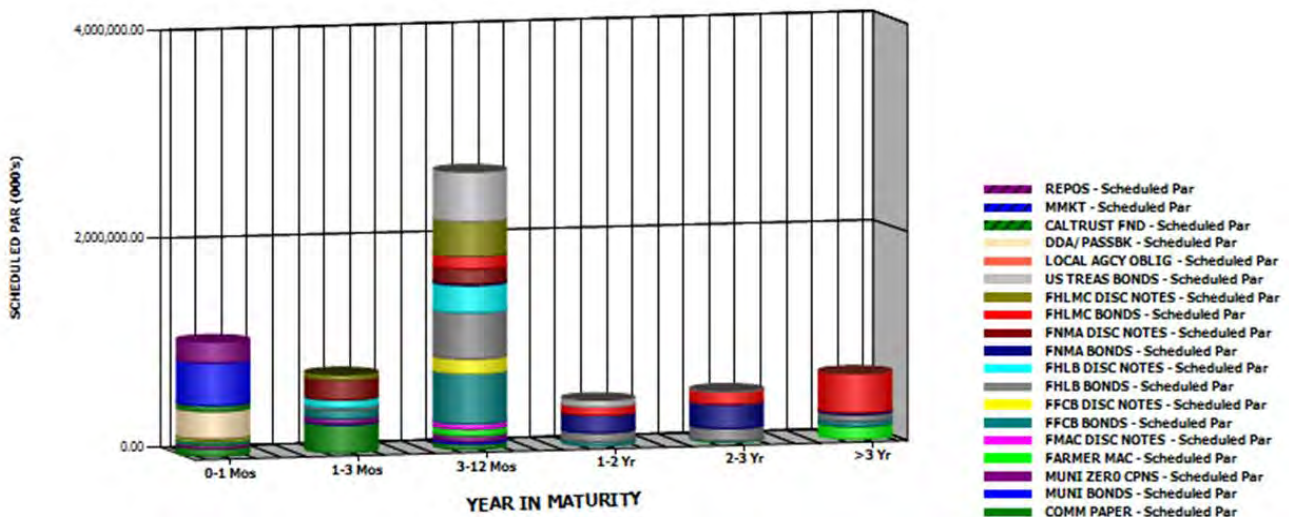

District staff is requesting the following changes in the scope of work for Change Order No. 1: (1) remove from the scope of work all activities related to permanent installation and install two interim portables and one portable restroom instead; (2) additional excavation required to compact the soil at the new parking lot; (3) remove a cement base that was discovered under the asphalt in the fire road and parking lot; (4) add conduits in the plumber’s trench for data, fire alarm and intrusion; (5) change out the fire line backflow device as requested by the City of Riverside; (6) revise the storm drain in the parking lot as per redesign; (7) install two removable bollards at the fire hydrant to allow access for the portable classrooms; and (8) reconfigure the irrigation and change out the service line at the backflow location.

Change Order No 1, in the amount of \$57,579.00, brings the total amount of the Purchase Order to \$643,979.00. Funding for this project is one hundred percent (100%) from the Community Facilities District 15.

Short Description: The Improving Head Start for School Readiness Act of 2007 made it a top priority for Head Start programs to ensure that all students are ready for Kindergarten. The School Readiness Goals identify the skills children demonstrate when they are Kindergarten ready.

DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:

The School Readiness Goals align with data from the Desired Results Developmental Profile (DRDP) assessment instrument created by the California Department of Education. The program has identified 14 measures that are predictors of success in Kindergarten. The DRDP is scored in October and then again in May of each school year for each preschool child. The goal is to have a majority of students score at the Building and Integrating levels at the end of the school year.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the Head Start School Readiness Goals.


Describe your program self-evaluation process

The Early Childhood Coordinator and the Early Childhood Services Specialist completed the ECERS site visits for each classroom with a specific focus on substantial portion of the day for free choice activities and play, using language to develop reasoning skills, informal use of language, supervision of gross motor activities, general supervision of children, discipline, staff-child interactions and interactions among children. ECERS visits took place between February 26 and March 9. A representative from Lakeshore was also present during the visits to create a list of items needed to improve Space and Furnishings scores. New materials were purchased based on the results of the visits.

ECERS results focused on the need for improvement in Using Language to Develop Reasoning Skills (5) and Informal Use of Language (5.8). The Early Childhood program will continue to focus on improvement in the areas of asking more why and how questions, having children explain their reasoning and Instructional Support as a whole according to the Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) guidelines. Staff development opportunities will be provided on a monthly basis.

The Family Services Supervisor and six Community Assistants randomly checked 60 student files from various sites for eligibility, enrollment, DRDP and other required documents. Notes were taken on each file if something needed correction.

During February 2015, the Early Childhood Coordinator and the Early Childhood Services Specialist used the 2014-15 Program Instruments tool to monitor each area and identify any items not fully meeting requirements.

Phonological Awareness increased slightly from 21% in 2013-14 to 25% in 2014-15. Letter and Word Knowledge improved from 41% in 2013-14 to 47% in 2014-15. This data does not take into account students who were not in the program the entire school year nor those who would be returning for a second year of preschool based on age. This data includes 3 and 4 year old children in the program. The program also tracks students when they enter Kindergarten the following year. The program's goal was to increase the percentage of students scoring Core on the DIBELS assessment from 43% to 50%. Data tracking 2013-14 preschool students shows that 53% of them scored CORE on the Beginning of the Year DIBELS assessment when they started Kindergarten in 2014-15. The program was previously a part of the Business Services Division and was moved to the Instructional Services Division at the beginning of the school year. This brought forth even more collaboration and support. Instructional Services Specialists were able to provide training for the preschool teachers in the areas of common core, early literacy, English learners, CELDT testing, DIBELS testing and mathematics. Describe your program self-evaluation process

The Early Impact Program is an Infant and Toddler program located at Lincoln Continuation High School in Riverside, CA. It provides an opportunity for teen parents attending Lincoln to continue their education while their child is cared for by the program. The RUSD Early Impact Program opened on January 26, 2015. The teen parents are identified by the counselor at the school site, then the Family Services Supervisor calls the teen parents to come to the school site for enrollment. The front office of the school and the Early Impact Program classroom have packets already made for parents to pick up with the list of documents needed for enrollment. Once the infant/toddler is enrolled, the parent can tour the facility as part of their orientation. The classroom teacher attended training for DRDP 2015 and ITERS this school year.

During the DRDP Process, the teacher conducts an assessment of each infant/toddler within the first 60 days of enrollment. Once the assessment is completed, the teacher meets with the parent to discuss the results and create goal(s) to work in conjunction with the parent. The first DRDP assessment was initiated on 2/27/15. The DRDP results will be shared with each parent during parent/teacher conferences. Parent/teacher conferences were initiated on 3/2/15 and will continue until the end of May 2015 due to the first day of enrollment being on different dates for different children.

The teacher at the Early Impact Program completed the ITERS-R. The Family Services Supervisor came to assist with the children (8) with three other assistants, while the teacher conducted the self review and completed the summary of findings. This was done on 3/25/15. The results of the ITERS will be discussed with the parents on 5/22/15 during the PAC meeting. A follow-up will be done on 6/5/15 to make the necessary changes.

The PAC for this year will only meet twice. However, the program has already contacted some community agencies to attend and be part of the presentations for the teen parents. A survey will be conducted during

the first week of classes to assess the needs of the current teen parents and serve as a guide for future parent training/meetings.

Head Start Policy Committee (PC) By-Laws have been revised to increase the quorum requirement in Section 7 (10% to 30%) to conduct business. Any revision to the Head Start Policy Committee By-Laws requires approval by the Board of Education.

Riverside Unified School District Head Start Policy Committee

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Riverside Unified School District Head Start Policy Committee; hereinafter referred to as the “Head Start PC Committee”.

ARTICLE II – PURPOSE AND FUNCTIONS

The purpose of the Head Start Policy Committee will be to serve as a decision-making body in accordance with 45 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 1304 and Appendix A. The Policy Committee shall abide by all Federal, State, Riverside Unified School District (RUSD) and Riverside County Office of Education (RCOE) laws, regulations, policies and procedures in conducting Head Start business and will work with the RUSD Board of Education, which is the Governing Body of the Delegate Agency. The Policy Committee will serve as an advisory and decision making body for the district’s Head Start program. In doing this, a quality program will be ensured for all children and families enrolled in the RUSD’S Head Start program. Under no circumstances shall the Policy Committee exceed its authority or limitations as identified by the aforementioned regulations.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP AND COMPOSITION

Section 1

Eligibility for Membership

To be eligible for membership of the Head Start Policy Committee, the legal guardian or parent of a currently enrolled Head Start child must be elected by their school site committee no later than September of each year. All members of the committee will be officially seated at the first regularly scheduled PC Meeting in October.

Section 2

Procedures for Election of Members

Each Head Start site shall elect two parents to sit on the Policy Committee. One alternate will be elected from each school site to serve as a proxy if a duly elected representative can not attend a committee meeting.

At the first PC meeting of each year, the Head Start parents will vote to approve community members as community representatives for the Policy Committee.

The Policy Committee shall vote for a Head Start parent to serve as the representative and one to serve as the alternate to attend the meetings of the Policy Council at the county level representing Riverside Unified School District’s Head Start program.

Section 3

Composition of the Policy Committee - Parents, Community Representatives and Alternates

At least 51% of the Policy Committee members must be parents/guardians of currently enrolled children in the Head Start program, in accordance with Head Start regulations.

* Up to 5 community members can be approved by the parent members to become voting members of the Policy Committee.

Section 4

Term of Office

All members of the Policy Committee shall serve for one program year from the time of their seating until the seating of the subsequent year’s Policy Committee. The seating of the PC shall take place at the first regularly scheduled meeting in October of each year.

The term of all classes of participation shall be limited to no more than three years, consecutive or otherwise. Any member participating for three months or more on the Policy Committee will be considered to have served one full year. The three year term limit applies to any combination of current parent or community representative participation on the PC.

Section 5

Voting Rights

Each Policy Committee voting member has one vote. A PC alternate member can only vote if the representative is not present.

Section 6

Termination of Membership

Termination of membership from the Policy Committee shall be prescribed only after serious consideration and review of the circumstances leading to this action. Any and all cases for termination will be treated with fairness to all parties concerned and in the best interests of the Head Start program and the children and families served. The document titled, "Early Childhood and Family Education Core Values and Code of Conduct" will be used as a guide in making any decision to terminate a member from the Policy Committee.

Any member of the Policy Committee may appeal the decision for termination of membership. The appeal must be in writing and submitted within ten working days to the Chairperson of the Committee, or in the event the termination proceedings were against a Chairperson, then to the Vice Chairperson of the Policy Committee. A copy of the request to appeal the termination must also be provided to the RUSD Coordinator of Early Childhood and Family Education. The appeal of termination will be placed on the agenda for the next PC meeting. A motion to consider the appeal must be made and approved by three-fourths of the total voting membership of the Policy Committee in order for the appeal to be reviewed by the PC. The terminated member shall have the right to speak before the Policy Committee to present new information or mitigating evidence regarding the reason for termination. The PC, upon conclusion of the hearing and reconsideration of the matter, may reverse their decision to terminate the member by three-fourths vote of the total voting membership. The results of this appeal are final.

Section 7

Meetings

The Policy Committee shall meet once every month with the exception of the months of June, July, August, September and December. PC members will be mailed board reports and updates over the summer. Any hiring decisions that need to be made over the summer will be done at a special emergency meeting. A quorum for transacting all business of the Policy Committee shall be ten (10%) percent of the Policy Committee's total voting membership.

A Parent Training will be scheduled for September. The day and time for the Policy Committee meetings will be established by the current membership of the following year in May. PC members will receive an email or written notice of all regular meetings at least seven work days prior to the regular meeting. Fliers will also be posted at each school site classroom before the meeting is to take place. An agenda of the upcoming meeting will be posted 72 hours prior to the scheduled PC meeting at the Early Childhood Office. A copy of the Minutes of the last meeting will be posted on the Parent Information Bulletin Board at each school site for public review.

Emergency Meetings

Emergency meetings may be called following at least twenty-four (24) hours notice to all members of the Policy Committee. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the notification of the meeting. The Coordinator of Early Childhood and Family Education may request emergency meetings.

Quorum and Authority to Conduct Business

The PC Committee shall consist of 12 Parent/Guardians as elected by their respective school sites and up to 5 Community Representatives as elected by the parent representatives. A quorum for transacting all business of the Policy Committee shall be thirty (30%) percent of the Policy Committee's total voting membership.

Non-Members and Staff Attendance at Meeting

Meetings are open to the public. Non-members, including staff, are able to attend. When a non-member is in attendance, they are only to observe at the meeting. They may not actively participate in the meeting unless called upon to do so by a Policy Committee Chairperson.

Non-members and individual members of the PC may address any issue of public concern for which the Policy Committee has authority to take action except in matters relating to personnel hiring/termination procedures or any other matters that may be governed by Federal or state confidentiality rules.

Upon request or agreement of the Policy Committee, staff consultation and input may be provided. Staff can be invited to attend meetings to provide reports, training, support, information, and to answer questions. The Coordinator of Early Childhood and Family Education or designee shall attend all meetings and shall be used as a resource personnel to the Policy Committee.

Closed Sessions

A closed session of the Policy Committee may be called in order to conduct business concerning RUSD personnel issues only. There shall be notice given to the public of closed sessions.

ARTICLE IV – DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Section 1

All PC Officers and Members of the Executive Committee shall be familiar with :

1. The By-laws of the Policy Committee
2. Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised
3. Federal Head Start Regulations (45 CFR 1304 and Appendix A)
4. Policies and Procedures of the RUSD Early Childhood and Family Education Programs

Section 2

Head Start Chairperson

During the election of Policy Committee officers, one Head Start parent shall be elected as Head Start Policy Committee Chairperson.

The Chairperson shall:

1. Preside as the Chairperson of the Policy Committee meetings.
2. The Head Start Chairperson shall act as a liaison member of the RUSD Governance Committee.
3. Call the PC meeting to order on time, follow the agenda and be able to clarify the business on hand.
4. Explain each motion before it is voted upon.
5. Make sure that all members are given equal opportunity to speak regarding motions made, while refraining from entering into the debates personally. If the Chairperson desires to voice an opinion, he/she must “pass the gavel” to the Vice Chairperson or another member of the Executive Committee to accept the temporary Chairperson’s position during the entire course of the debate and until final vote on the motion. Upon announcement of the final vote on the motion, the Chairperson may resume his/her position as Chairperson of the Policy Committee.
6. Appoint members to ad hoc committees, if those committees are approved by the PC.
7. Vote only to break a tie.
8. Serves as an ex-officio member of all committees.
9. Serves on oral screening panels, when requested by the RUSD Coordinator of Early Childhood and Family Education.

Recording Secretary

The Recording Secretary shall:

1. Maintain a current list of all Policy Committee members, including their names, addresses and phone numbers.
2. Record the minutes of the Policy Committee meetings and provide a draft copy to the RUSD Coordinator of Early Childhood and Family Education. Ensure all motions are recorded exactly as stated. Minutes shall include the names of all PC members present.
3. Serves on the Executive Committee as the Recording Secretary for all Executive Committee meetings.
4. Serves on oral screening panels, when requested by the RUSD Coordinator of Early Childhood and Family Education.

Section 3

Vacancies of Policy Committee Members and Officers

Current Parent/Guardian Representatives

The vacancy of a current parent/guardian representative shall be filled immediately by an election by the appropriate group that originally selected that Policy Committee parent/guardian representative.

Officers of the Executive Committee

Upon notification of the vacancy, the Chairperson, shall immediately appoint a member of the council to temporarily fill the vacant position. At the next regularly scheduled or emergency meeting of the PC, the acting Chairperson shall announce the vacant office and ask for nominations for filling the vacant position. Upon closing nominations for the vacant position, a vote will be cast to fill the vacant office.

Section 4

Voting Procedures

Vote cards shall be used in all voting procedures. The Chairperson of the Policy Committee votes only to make or break a tie.

Section 5

Relatives of Head Start Staff serving as Policy Committee Officers

In order to preclude situations which could bring about conflict of interest for Head Start staff members as well as Policy Committee members, a PC member shall not be appointed to the position of Chairperson, Vice Chairperson or Recording Secretary where a member of his/her immediate family is a Head Start staff member.

Immediate family members include the PC member's spouse, children and/or step children, parents and grandparents, brother, sister or relative by marriage of comparable degree.

ARTICLE V – COMMITTEES

Section 1

The Policy Committee shall have three standing committees:

1. Executive Committee
2. Program Planning Committee
3. Governance Committee

ARTICLE VI – POLICY COMMITTEE TRAVEL, ATTENDANCE AT CONFERENCES AND TRAINING SEMINARS

Policy Committee Members will be elected to attend conferences and/or training seminars as funding allows throughout the program year. All PC members must meet the following criteria to be eligible for travel and for attendance at conferences and/or training seminars throughout the year:

- The selected representative must be an active voting PC member.
- The selected representative must present all receipts for expenditures and unspent monies to the RUSD Coordinator of Early Childhood and Family Education within 10 days of the closing of a session. Members with previous outstanding expenses will not be eligible to travel or to attend conferences and/or training seminars.

ARTICLE VII – POLICY COMMITTEE REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENDITURES

The guidelines established by Business Services under the authorization of the RUSD Board of Education shall be used for reimbursement of expenditures.

ARTICLE VIII – IMPASSE

Section 1

Definition

An impasse situation occurs when the Policy Committee votes to approve or disapprove an action item on a scheduled meeting agenda and the final vote on that item is in disagreement with the decision of the RUSD Board of Education on that same action item.

Section 2

Procedure for Resolution of an Impasse

The Impasse Resolution Procedure is provided in Appendix A “Internal Dispute Resolution Program Procedure (Impasse)”. The resolution of any impasse shall follow this procedure and this procedure is hereby made part of these by-laws by reference.

ARTICLE IX – AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS

Amendments to these by-laws may be approved by a majority vote of those members who are present and voting at any regular meeting of the Policy Committee at which a quorum is present and the proposed amendment has been placed on the agenda for final approval.

APPENDIX A
RIVERSIDE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT
HEAD START PARENT POLICY COMMITTEE
AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION
INTERNAL DISPUTE POLICY

When an agreement cannot be reached, the Policy Committee and the Board of Education designee(s) will review and discuss information in closed session. If an impasse is created, the following procedure will be followed. The RUSD Superintendent or designee designates a mediator to carry out a negotiation process involving the Policy Committee and assigned Board of Education designee(s) until an agreement is reached.

Disputes shall be limited to the scope of those areas defined by applicable Federal regulations. If the Board of Education designee(s) and Policy Committee cannot resolve a dispute within seven (7) working days following notification by either party of the existence of a dispute, then the following procedure will apply:

- a) Each party shall appoint two (2) persons to act as impartial panelists in an attempt to resolve the dispute. The parties shall mutually appoint a fifth person. The appointed individual shall not be a person involved in any manner in the dispute.
- b) This dispute resolution group shall convene no later than twelve (12) working days following notification of appointment and the existence of a dispute. The dispute resolution group shall meet for a maximum of four (4) hour sessions during the subsequent seven (7) working days to resolve the dispute.

NOTIFICATION OF PROCEDURES FOR THE DISMISSAL OF
PERMANENT EMPLOYEES

Procedures for dismissal of all Head Start permanent employees must follow the Riverside Unified School District Board Policies, California Education Code as well as the California School Employees Association (CSEA) and the Riverside City Teachers Association (RCTA) Collective Bargaining Agreements. These include that the employee shall be given prior written notice informing the employee of the intended action, the effective date, a specific statement of the charges and reasons and the right to respond and request a hearing. The Head Start administration will discuss these procedures with the Policy Advisory Committee in October.

DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:

The Governor’s State Budget identified \$500 million within the Adult Education Block Grant that will be distributed to the various AB 86 Consortia throughout the state to fund adult education programs during 2015-16. As part of the Budget Trailer Bill, AB 104, the members of each consortium must establish a governance plan that will address the various requirements outlined within AB 104 including, but not limited to, a process for distributing local funding; submission of annual performance reports; and updating the existing regional plan. The Budget Trailer bill also requires within Ed Code Section 84905 (c), that each member of the local consortium shall only be represented by an official who has been designated by the governing board of the member. Only school districts and community college districts are considered members of the local AB 86 consortia

FISCAL IMPACT: None

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education designate Antonio Garcia as representative for AB 86 About Students Regional Consortium for Adult Education.

The agreement is documented as 1) Memorandum of Understanding dated May 13, 2015, Elective Rotation at Frank Augustus Miller Middle School, 2) Memorandum of Understanding dated June 11, 2015, Common Core Staff Development Specialist, 3) Memorandum of Understanding dated June 11, 2015, Teacher On Special Assignment, 4) Memorandum of Understanding dated July 1, 2015, Faculty Members at Liberty Elementary School, 5) Memorandum of Understanding dated July 1, 2015, Faculty Members at Riverside STEM Academy High School, and 6) Memorandum of Understanding dated July 1, 2015, Staff Development Specialist work year calendar. The Memorandums of Understanding are the result of the collective bargaining process that began in September 2014.

This agenda item is intended to meet the public disclosure requirements of Assembly Bill 1200 (1991/1213) and Assembly Bill 2756 (2004/52). More specifically, AB 27/56 amended Government Code Section 3547.5 to provide in part that, “before a public school employer enters into a written agreement with an exclusive representative covering matters within the scope of representation, the major provisions of the agreement, including, but not limited to, the costs that

would be incurred by the public school employer under the agreement for the current and subsequent fiscal years, shall be disclosed at a public meeting of the public school employer.”

The Riverside Unified School District (RUSD) and the Riverside City Teachers Association (RCTA) enter into the provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to specifically address the Elective Rotation at Frank Augustus Miller Middle School for the 2015-2016 school year.

It is understood by both parties that Frank Augustus Miller desires to continue their practice of implementing an A/B week electives rotation schedule. In this rotation, students are simultaneously enrolled in a pair of one- semester elective classes that are taught during the two semesters of the school year. The majority of the paired classes include a foreign language class with a VAPA class.

- Students attend the "A" week class one week and the "B" week class the next week and follow this rotation pattern for the duration of the school year.
- Students attend each class for a total of 18 weeks (one semester in total) which is spread across the school year.
- During the course of a week, elective teachers only teach 25 sections and only have contact with a maximum, of 175 students.
- Each rotation elective class is worth 2.5 units per semester.
- When the total GPA is calculated in AERIES, both elective classes combined equal 5.0 units and the GPA is calculated accordingly.

Short Description: Approval is requested for site fund expenditures of the John W. North High School Varsity Volleyball Team traveling to Phoenix, Arizona, and the Riverside Polytechnic High School Mock Trial Team traveling to Atlanta, Georgia.

DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:

On July 20, 2015, the Board approved the John W. North High School Varsity Volleyball Team to travel to Phoenix, Arizona, to participate in the Nike Tournament of Champions Volleyball Tournament on October 1-4, 2015. The Board also approved the Riverside Polytechnic High School Mock Trial Team to travel to Atlanta, Georgia, to compete in the Empire Mock Trial Team Tournament on September 10-14, 2015. Since the approval of these field trips, it has been determined there will be fiscal impact to the school site budgets, not to exceed the following amounts:

- John W. North High School - \$1,800
 - Travel expenses for 1 Administrator and 1 Coach, to include hotel and food
 - Teacher sub cost for 2 days

- Polytechnic High School - \$4,500
 - Travel expenses for 1 Administrator and 1 Coach, to include air, hotel and food
 - Teacher sub cost for 3 days

FISCAL IMPACT: \$6,300
