Board Members' Comments

Dr. Beaty talked about the Remembering 9/11 Program that was shared at three of our high schools (Arlington, John W. North, and Ramona High Schools) on Monday, September 12. He mentioned the City of Riverside's Spirit Award recognition of Mrs. Allavie for her great contributions to the community. He said the first Superintendent's Night Out at Sierra Middle School was well received, and thanked Dr. Miller for his work and preparation that he put into the event. He discussed attending three Principals' Summits, and commented that they were even more professional than past years. Dr. Beaty mentioned attending Poly's SRT (Student Responsibility Team) meetings and stated how impressed he is with the work that goes on in the meetings. In closing, Dr. Beaty indicated that a local realtor provide him information about major VFW (Veterans of Foreign Wars) scholarships that he was going to provide to District staff.

Mrs. Cloud agreed with the information that Dr. Beaty provided regarding the Spirit Award that Mrs. Allavie received and offered her congratulations. She noted that the Superintendent's Night Out was very successful. She mentioned attending the YWCA's Women of Achievement Luncheon with Mrs. Allavie where several great women of Riverside were honored. Mrs. Cloud talked about a Measure I reception she attended recently. She stated that on October 1, RUSD, headed up by Ms. Woodie Rucker-Hughes, Manager/Child Welfare and Attendance, is hosting a "Families in Transition Summit" at Ramona High School. She said the new school year is very exciting, and agreed with Dr. Beaty that the Principals' Summits are motivating and the principals have a real can-do attitude.

Mr. Vanderzyl congratulated Mrs. Allavie, and said that her recognition was well deserved.

Mrs. Allavie thanked everyone who was able to come to the Spirit Award recognition, and Mr. Hunt for his thoughtful comments. She discussed a follow-up article to her parent responsibilities article from the last Board meeting titled, "Parent Trigger" from today's *LA Times*. She said the article focuses on how we are accounting for the year of growth in a child, which she feels ties into our Principals' Summits. Mrs. Allavie indicated that she has attended 14 Principals' Summits, she feels that they are much better than last year, and thanked Dr. Miller for his cogent comments.

Mr. Hunt said that the event for Mrs. Allavie was a great event to celebrate her volunteerism. He indicated that he would like to attend the Principals' Summits, but his work schedule is a conflict and suggested that at least one could be taped. Mr. Hunt stated that he would like to see a resolution of support to endorse Measure I.



DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:

In 2002 the voters of the City of Riverside passed Measure C to provide a secure, dedicated funding source for the City's libraries. Measure C passed with a 69% majority assessing a \$19 annual parcel tax on property within the City. Measure C had a ten year term and will expire in June 2012. In 2010-11, Measure C is generating \$1.43 million for libraries, representing 22% of the overall budget for city library services.

If approved, Measure I will allow the City to continue funding for library programs that assist children with homework and reading skills as well as allow the libraries to address future priorities which include expanded hours of operation, computers and library programming. Measure I will extend the current Measure C parcel tax – continuing the \$19 per parcel annual assessment, restricted for library uses and for a duration of ten years.

FISCAL IMPACT: None. No District resources have been allocated to the support of Measure I.
