## Attendance Terms

When students are not in school, they miss out on valuable instructional time!

## Research and Data Tell Us...

- Attendance is the \#1 indicator of dropout and graduation rates
- Chronically absent students in Kinder scored 20\% lower in reading and math in later grades and are 2X more likely to be retained
- There is a $25 \%$ drop in likelihood of graduating high school in four years when students are absent between 5-9 days per semester
- The effect of chronic absence on graduation rates is cumulative with every year of chronic absenteeism, a higher percentage of students dropout of school

- Develop "back-up plans" and people to help in the case of an unforeseen problem (parent illness, car breaks down, etc.)
- Reach out to school/district staff when you need support and/or resources
